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HOW LABYRINTHS CAN ACTIVATE COMMUNITIES

PLACES AND OUTCOMES FOR COMMUNITY LABYRINTHS

- Utilise vacant lots/ fields and associated infrastructure
- Become a gathering and focal point for a community hall, garden or play space
- Provide reflective opportunities for members of the whole community
- Become a tourist destination and encourage visitors to engage with a public space
- Long term visions can combine local ideas as well as visitor needs
- Impermanent installation can activate 'pop up' labyrinths

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Community forums to discuss and brainstorm options
- Involve local school and interest groups
- Invite partnerships from other communities within a region
- Choices for construction to include skills and resources from within a local region
- Opportunities to run a series of creative workshops in conjunction with the labyrinth construction to produce planting, outdoor furniture, landscaping, signage, decorative elements eg mosaic, paving tiles.

ASSISTANCE FROM MARK AND THE LABYRINTH COLLECTIVE

- Facilitation of design for long term and short term plans
- Documentation of design for community consultation
- Utilise community cultural development and regional tourism grants
- Help with writing grant applications
- Co-create the project with local groups, schools, volunteers and suppliers.
